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Eltham Palace and Gardens



Eltham Palace is one of the few important medieval royal palaces in England to survive with substantial remains intact. Initially a moated manor house with vast parkland, it was acquired by the future Edward II in 1305 who subsequently passed it on to his Queen, Isabella. King Henry VIII was the last monarch to spend substantial amounts of money or time at the Palace which fell into decline after being eclipsed by Greenwich Palace. In the 1930’s a magnificent Art Deco mansion was built by Stephen and Virginia Courtauld adjoining the Great Hall. Set in a medieval palace with stunning interiors and furnishing, it reflects the high fashion of 1930s. We will also be visiting the medieval Great Hall, the childhood home of Henry VIII.
